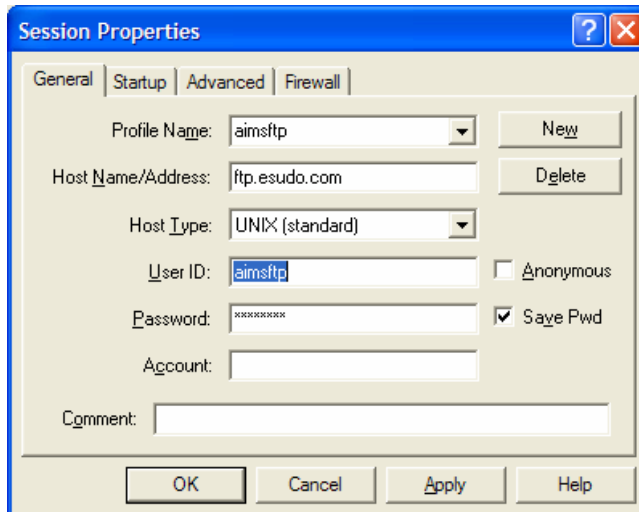
To publish your web site, you need to design, create and post them online. This document will guide on how-to post or upload your created web files online.

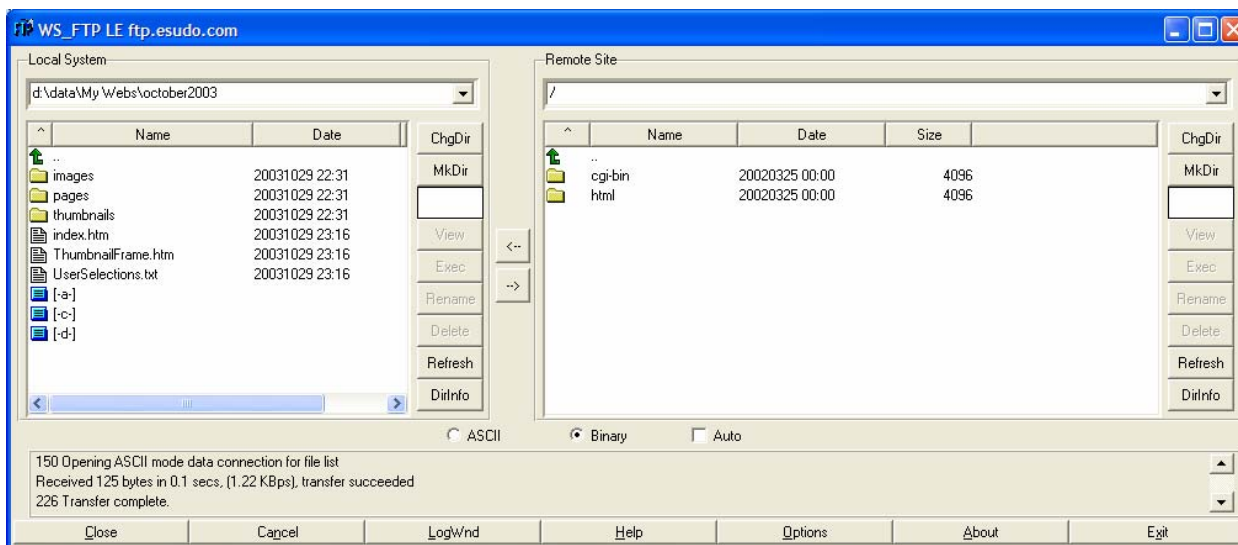
FTP Access

To upload web files using FTP, you'll need to have an FTP client, such as WS_FTP LE or Pro. For this example, we'll be use WS_FTP LE to connect to Esudo FTP server. WS_FTP LE is available for free at www.download.com.

1. Create a profile to Esudo FTP Server, ftp.esudo.com. This involves entering FTP host name/address, ftp.esudo.com, your FTP username or user ID and password. Your FTP username and password was provided by Esudo Technical support. See the figure below:



2. Connecting to server. Click OK to connect to the ftp server. If everything is correct, you should see the following directories on the server: cgi-bin and html. You want to put all your HTML files and images in html directory. The cgi-bin is your CGI scripts only. The figure below shows a successful login to the server. NOTE: There are two columns: left is the local computer files and right is the remote server files.



3. Transferring files to the server. There are file types: ASCII (text files) and Binary (images, executable, PDF). Most of the time, you should use Binary or Auto when transferring to the server. To transfer the files or directory from the local computer to the ftp server, select the files in the left column and click on right pointing arrow (→). The process is reverse if you need to transfer files from the ftp server to the local computer.
4. Once you have transferred all your web files, you can view them online at <http://www.yourdomain.com/>. That concludes our FTP process.
